

Images

An image is any kind of a graphics file that is rendered as a picture on the web page. An image is made up of pixels. Pixel stands for “picture element”. A pixel is a single rectangular point in a larger graphic image made up of many rectangular points that form a grid.

There are many kinds of graphic formats. The following are the most common:

- BMP – Bitmap (*.bmp)
- EMF – Enhanced MetaFile (*.emf)
- GIF - Graphics Interchange Format (*.gif)
- JPEG - Joint Photographic Experts Group (*.jpg or *.jpeg)
- PNG - Portable Network Graphics (*.png)
- TIFF - Tagged Image File Format (*.tiff)

In HTML, the tag is used to display an image. The tag is one of the few HTML tags which have no element content. Use the *height* or *width* attribute on the tag to change the pixel height or width.

The attributes are:

Attribute	Means?	Mandatory?	Sample
src	Source File	Mandatory	src="mydog.jpg"
alt	Alternate Text	Mandatory	alt="A picture of my dog"
title	Flyover Text	Optional	title="A picture of my dog"
width	Width	Optional	width="120px"
height	Height	Optional	height="50px"

The alternate text, as specified by the *alt* attribute, will be displayed on the page if the browser is unable to find the image. If the user cursors over an image on a webpage, the flyover text, as specified by the *title* attribute, will pop up.

Example:

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Because the tag has no element content and no end tag, the “/” that normally makes up the end tag is found before the ending angle bracket.

Note: You should never use both width and height in the same tag!

Image File Names

Developers of web pages should be extra careful when naming files. All file names should use the following symbols and no others:

- Lowercase letters a-z
- Numerals 0-9
- Dash –
- Underscore _

The following are examples of legal file names:

- pg001.jpg
- imag9.bmp
- carlos-monahan.png
- my_favorite_friend.gif

The following file names are *not* acceptable:

- Kobe_Bryant.jpg (upper case letters)
- My Favorite Friend.jpg (upper case letters and spaces)
- o'donnell.gif (quote)
