Exploring Computer Science Web #3 – The Seasons

Objective: Create a web page using HTML and CSS showing your understanding of margins, padding, and borders. Also, use the tag correctly.

- 1. In your *Exploring Computer Science* folder, create a folder titled *first_last_web_3*. Copy the *template.html* file and paste it in your *first_last_web_3* folder. Rename the *template.html* file to *index.html* (all lowercase!).
- 2. Edit the *index.html* file. Add the appropriate HTML so that this file contains the following:
 - a. The title of the page is First Last Web Page 3
 - b. Inside the <body> element, create a <div> element with an id of *content*. The following should be added inside this <div> element.
 - c. Inside the <div> element, create an <h1> element with the following content: First Last The Seasons.
 - d. Following the <h1> element, create a element with the following content: *This web page describes* what I feel about each season of the year.
 - e. Following the element, you are to create an <h2> element for each season of the year in the following order: Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall. There will be 4 <h2> elements in the file, one for each season.
 - f. After **each** <h2> element, write a good paragraph (5-6 sentences) (inside a element) describing what you do during that season. Describe what you like about the season. Describe what you dislike about the season. Describe any special holidays you celebrate during that season.
- 3. Find some text that you wish to highlight in some way and surround it with a element. You must use the tag at least 3 times.
- 4. Now add CSS for the following:
 - a. You must have a graphic as a background image. The graphic will frame the rest of the web page.
 - b. Make sure you use hexadecimal notation for all colors.
 - c. Pick a background color for the <div> element that compliments the graphic. Make the <div> 700 pixels wide. Make sure the <div> is centered on the page.
 - d. Make sure your default page font is appropriate.
 - e. The h1 element is a **cursive or fantasy** font. Make sure the font name is appropriate for the font family.
 - f. The h2 element is a **cursive or fantasy** font. Make sure the font name is appropriate for the font family.
 - g. The em element is something unique and interesting. You must have CSS for this element.
 - h. Be creative in showing that you know how to use background colors, text colors and borders to create interesting text boxes.
 - i. Be sure to use appropriate margins and padding. Text must not be too close to borders or edges.
 - j. You must have at least one border that doesn't go around the entire box.
- 5. Validate your HTML
- 6. Validate your CSS.
